Communicator Advocacy

In IB PYP, being a Communicator means we understand and express ideas and information confidently and creatively in more than one language and in a variety of modes of communication. Being a communicator may spring from new learning and result in Action in the form of Advocacy - seeking to ensure that people, particularly those who are most vulnerable in society, can have their voice heard on issues that are important to them. As a Communicator and an Advocate you may want to share your learning and concerns with family, friends, and all who will listen; send letters and emails to local and global officials to communicate your ideas; write articles and stories about issues important to you; give a speech and teach others about your cause; attend a talk to listen to other perspectives; or maybe join others with similar passions to get your voices heard!

Talk with your family about what values your family holds and explore issues and topics that align with these values. Then do some research together to see how you can communicate your opinions or bring awareness to that issue by becoming Communicators and for your cause!

Bridging the Digital Divide

As we close our World Works unit focusing on *Technological advances can change how we live our lives*, we want to also connect to our Action focus of Advocacy. The issue of digital equity and access was exacerbated due to the pandemic and the closures of schools. It is crucial that all students have equitable access to broadband services and computers during this time and in the future.

What is the digital divide?

The digital gap is the gap between demographics and areas that have access to modern information and communications technology from those who do not.

Who does it affect?

The Federal Communications Commission reports the digital divide disproportionately affects:

Old vs. Young

Able-Bodied vs. Disabled

Wealthy vs. Poor

Rural vs. Urban

White vs. People of Color

Communicator Advocacy

How can I talk to my children about social issues and empower them to use their voices?

1. Choose an issue.

Take cues from your child. Your child may have questions or concerns about what they see and hear in the world around them. Even the youngest child can understand the idea of fairness. Use those as a starting point to speak about an issue in which he/she shows interest.

2. Discuss your position.

Why does this issue matter to you, your family, and/or child? What do you know about this issue? Do a little research and learn about it together. Be sure to involve many points of views and, again, take cues from your child to know how much information to share and discuss.

3. Find ways to advocate or volunteer together. Simply finding out more together or addressing a child's question or concern can be an Action in itself. If you child Is wanting to learn and do more, ask your child for ideas of how they think they would want or could help. Then research opportunities for family-friendly ways to advocate for that issue and cause.
